Special Chapter/Individual Projects:

Daughters of Grace Chapter, Trinity, Beaver: Daughters lead Thirty Days of Prayer, a Lenten study involving the entire congregation on ways to pray; also they crochet prayer blankets for people who are shut in or hospitalized.

St. Teresa of Avila Chapter, St. Paul's Monongahela: Daughters anonymously "adopt" a child or two from the local elementary school in order to buy them Christmas presents. They provide winter coats, hats, gloves, boots, shoes and several outfits. They also give the family a gift card for a local grocery store.

Holy Comforter Chapter, Fox Chapel: Daughters spearhead a Dove Project at Thanksgiving and Easter when they obtain names of needy families from a center in Sharpsburg. They invited parishioners to join them in creating food baskets, according to need, for each family. They also create Prayer Blankets for those who are hospitalized or shut in.

Joan of Arc Chapter, St. Thomas in the Fields, Gibsonia: Daughters make Anglican Rosaries for those needing prayer.

Mary and Martha Chapter, St. Martin's, Monroeville: The Health Fair that Daughters had planned for the spring has been postponed until fall.

Christ the King Chapter, St. Paul's, Mt. Lebanon: One member heads a Prayer Tree.

Deborah Chapter, Christ Church, Indiana: All Daughters in the chapter are involved in individual community service projects.

Ruth Chapter, Good Shepherd, Hazelwood: Daughters prepare a feast the day before Thanksgiving for the entire community; they also cook soup and stew for the community during the year; they also visit the sick and help them with their housecleaning or whatever else they need.

Mary and Martha Chapter, St. Peter's, Butler: Daughters have been working with the Salvation Army in Butler. One month they served lunch; another month the baked cookies for their lunch program. Projects vary from month to month.

Diocesan Goals: To grow as an Order, especially recruiting younger members who can replace us as we age--strong women whose roots grow deep in the Lord, women who will help us build on His firm foundation.
