Board Meetings: July 2010, Oct.2010, Monthly by e-mail

Special Chapter/Individual Projects:

St. Brigid expanded their knitting ministry to include prayer shawls. They continue to knit dishcloths and pot holders for our  
missionaries in Africa.

Lydia worked with Habitat for Humanity, sponsored receptions for special occasions, did a quiet day in Advent and a church cleanup  
just before Easter.

Mary Magdalene provided towels for the homeless at the YMCA, provided cookies for the reception area at Lisa's Place  
(hospice), provided meals for a family whose child had an extended hospital stay. They also did Advent bags and attended an  
Advent Quiet Day at St. Joseph Seminary.

Sisters of the Shepherd assign members to individual homebound church members for in-depth visits and contacts. They made  
Advent bags for shut-ins, sponsored a Mothers' Day Tea, and had a Quiet Day with St. Monnica.

St. Monnica is sponsoring a the formation of a Jr. Daughters chapter with 10 girls in study and preparation for installment in August.  
The have expanded their ministry to the Lori Yeager Juvenile Detention Center. They made Advent bags for college students and  
shut-ins.

St. Margaret of Scotland continued to sponsor the Kerosene Fund that helps to keep community families warm in the cold winter  
weather.

St. Elizabeth of Hungary makes homemade cookies to give to people who visit their Parish on Sundays. They have lots of visitors  
because they are so near to Marshall University. They also sponsored a blood drive for the American Red Cross.

Hannah, along with other members of their Parish, have taken on a large inner city project called HIS Bridge Builders. This includes  
Bible study along with all the cleaning, painting, etc. needed to revitalize the neighborhood.
